History of Psychology, the official journal of APA Division 26 (The Society for the History of Psychology), began publishing in early 1998 under the editorship of Michael Sokal.

This journal appears quarterly in issues of 100 pages each and serves as a forum for both psychologists and other scholars exploring the full

range of current ideas and approaches relevant to the relationship between history and psychology.

It features refereed articles addressing all aspects of psychology's past and of its interrelationship with the many contexts within which it has emerged and has been practiced.

It also publishes scholarly work in closely related areas, such as historical psychology (the history of consciousness and behavior), psychohistory, theory in psychology as it pertains to history, historiography, biography and autobiography, and the teaching of the history of psychology.

History of Psychology also features essay reviews of thematically related sets of books and other media addressing issues important for an understanding of psychology's history.

Subscriptions are on a calendar year basis, February through November. Back issues in February are automatically forwarded. Allow 4-6 weeks for delivery.

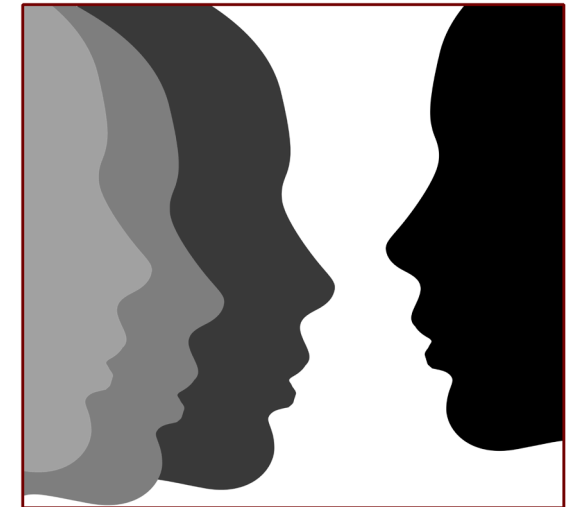
